MOVING FIREWOOD CAN TRANSPORT FOREST INSECTS AND DISEASES.



Tree-killing pests can hitchhike on infested firewood — accidentally creating new infestations that destroy our street trees, forests, and natural areas.

Protect your favorite places from this threat:

- Buy locally harvested firewood.
- Tell your friends not to move firewood.
- When you travel, ask a park ranger or campground host about where to get local firewood.
- Use firewood from nearby sources to heat your home or cabin.

Buy it where you burn it.



Infestations of invasive insects and diseases can kill tens of thousands of trees in just a few years.

Prevention is the key. Don't move firewood when you travel, camp, or visit another state.


